Concede Adicional Insalubridade a servidora **LUCINEIA DA SILVA SANTOS**.

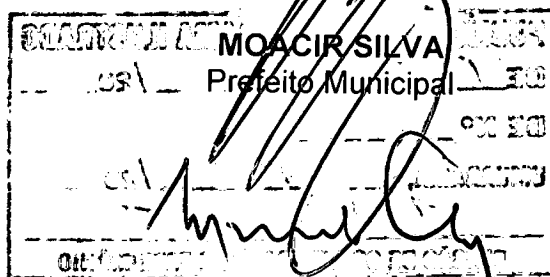
O PREFEITO MUNICIPAL DE UMUARAMA, ESTADO DO PARANÁ, no uso de suas atribuições legais,
